

Structural Technologies

Compulsory Equipment:

In September all students are required to bring in the following:

- Pens, pencils and a notebook/A4 folder Backpack/Bag
- Appropriate clothing for practical construction lessons (cargo trousers, overalls, safety boots).



Uniform and PPE:

Safety boots are compulsory for all practical sessions. These will need to be brought with you on the first day of your course and should be stored in your bag after class and taken home.

Students are to wear cargo trousers or overalls for all practical lessons. No loose fitting clothing is permitted during practical lessons.

You will be issued with a college ID card and lanyard at enrolment that you are **expected to wear at all times outside of practical sessions**. If you lose your ID, there will be a £5 charge to replace.

Health & Safety:

• No hoodies worn up, caps, hats or outdoor jackets are to be worn in the classrooms during lessons



- Jewelry and piercings that are loose fitting may have to be removed during practical lessons to ensure the safety of the individual.
- No headphones or music earbuds can be worn during lessons at any time.
- No mobile phones to be used within classes or workshops unless directed by the Lecturer
- All students will have to adhere to health & safety signage in the workshops

Industry Placement:

- As part of the Structural Technologies study program students are required to carry out industry placement. This can be completed within any area of the construction industry. Students are encouraged to find their own placement and will be supported by the staff at Langley college. All employers accepting industry placement students will be visited by the industry placement team, to ensure that they comply with health and safety regulations and have public liability and employers insurance.
- Industry Placement is a mandatory element of your study programme. All Level 1s will complete an internal placement. Level 2 Construction students undertake a 2 week external block-placement. Whilst Level 3 students undertake block-placement and Day release placements. All Placement dates will be confirmed at Enrolment and during induction.
- **IMPORTANT:** Please note that we are reviewing our placement hours, in line with government guidance regarding technical qualifications. As such, our placement 'offer' may change prior to the academic year starting. We are not expecting it to change, but If it does, our Industry Placement Team will be in touch via email to you and your next of kin.
